Interpedia – already 50 years in a changing world, prioritizing the rights of the child

ven the ancient Greek philosopher Heraclitus is said to have mentioned "Everything flows, nothing stays still", i.e. everything is in motion and changing. Interpedia's 50-year journey has also seen many changes and upheavals, caused by both external and internal factors.

Interpedia can be considered an organization whose ultimate mission is basically to make itself redundant. Although many things in the world have changed for the better during Interpedia's existence, the last few years have also shown – as Heraclitus already told – that even positive developments are not permanent, but the world and humanity may take steps backwards. In such a world, there is still a great need for organizations like Interpedia.

While the world and the field in which Interpedia operates have changed and Interpedia has developed along with them, certain things have remained unchanged. At the center of all Interpedia's activities has always been, and still is today, the child's rights to balanced development and a safe environment to

1974-2024

Interpedia's five decades

he history of Interpedia is part of the history of intercountry adoptions and development cooperation in Finland. Already in the 1960s, awareness of the gap between poor and rich countries aroused solidarity towards third world nations in Finland as well. The desire to help especially vulnerable children appealed to more and more people.

Interpedia starts intercountry adoptions in Finland

The end of the Korean War in 1953 is considered the most significant milestone in intercountry adoption activities in the world. In Finland, interest in intercountry adoptions arose in the early 1970s based on the experiences and example of other Nordic countries.

Previously, most of the adoptions in our country had been adoptions of Finnish babies. A few hundred children were also adopted from Finland to other Nordic countries from the 1950s until the 1970s. The first child who received a home from Finland through intercountry adoption arrived in 1971, when Finland was still a country that sent children for adoption.

In 1972 families interested in intercountry adoption and helping children in developing countries had their first discussions about organizing themselves. Finally the decision to found their own organization was made in Närpiö on May 18, 1974. Hjälp till Nödställda Barn (Help for children in need), later Interpedia, was born.

Gradually more and more internationally adopted children began to arrive in Finland during the 1970s. Since the 1980s, the number of children adopted from abroad grew steadily until 2005, when 308 children got a new home in Finland. Since then, the number of adoptions has decreased until recent years. The downward trend is a global phenomenon.

From a small child sponsorship association to a professional development cooperation organization

From the early days of the association, the founders and first members of Interpedia wanted to help the children of poor countries in their own country as well. The first official child sponsorship program was established in 1978, when Agneta Glad was assigned a child to sponsor through the Canadian organization Families for Children (FFC), and she decided to organize the same opportunity for others interested in helping as well.

In 1981, the first development cooperation project supported by the Finnish Ministry of Foreign Affairs was started in Somalia together with FFC. Over the decades, development cooperation and sponsorship activities have expanded and become more professional. Currently, Interpedia's development cooperation operates in seven different countries, and there are a total of five projects funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Nepal and Ethiopia.

Global education in Finnish schools and early childhood education has been running alongside development cooperation for years. The aim of the education is to raise the awareness of Finnish children and young people about the lives of children in developing countries, children's rights and sustainable development.

The timeline of this publication compiles milestones from Interpedia's five-decade history. The volunteer organization founded by a few families has grown into a professional adult and has influenced the lives of thousands of children over the course of half a century.



1974-2024

The 1970s

Interpedia was founded and the association, which was initially ran by volunteers, distributed advice and contact information to families interested in intercountry adoption. International connections were created, and operating principles were refined. The child sponsorship programs began.

1974

"One of Interpedia's earliest partners was the Canadian organization Families for Children, which had children's homes and child sponsorship operations. In 1978, we got our son from the organization's children's home in India. Even before he came to Finland, I contacted FFC's child sponsorship coordinator to get a child that I could sponsor, preferably at our son's children's home in Coimbatore. So we got our first child to sponsor, Babul, about 8 years old. He was found in poor condition at a bus station in a neighbouring town. He eventually got new parents and I got new children to sponsor, until after a few years I chose to become a project sponsor instead. The sponsorship has lasted for almost 47 years.

In the first years, I was FFC's sponsorship coordinator in Finland, and made sure that people paid their sponsor fee and received their sponsor post. I personally delivered mail to some sponsors in the Vasa region. At that time, Interpedia did not yet have a single employee. Pretty soon, the association took over responsibility for all child sponsorship activities."

The 1980s

The first development cooperation projects supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs were started. The child sponsorship programs grew rapidly. Interpedia did a lot of advocacy work to get intercountry adoptions into legislation. Official adoption service provider status was achieved with the law reform in 1985. Cultural groups were established, and preparatory courses for adoptive parents were developed.

1980

1984


- Provisions on intercountry adoptions were added to the new adoption law.

- Adoption cooperation with Thailand and the Dominican Republic began
- The activities of cultural groups began, the first being Ethiopia
- In October-November, the first sponsors' trip to South India
- New child sponsorship programs: MSS in Madras and the Kookal project in South India (ICWS)

- There were already five employees in the office, and the new executive director Tarja Monto started her work.
- Interpedia's regional operations expanded.

1988

The 1990s

Benefits and financial aid for adoptive families were advocated, and together with Nordic colleagues Interpedia participated in the preparation of the Hague Convention. At the beginning of the decade the depression slowed down the growth.


Interpedia 25 years

The 2000s

The number of children adopted to Finland increased to a peak, especially with adoptions from China. The role as an adoption organization began to change from a family organization to an official actor along with the changes in the organization field. International child sponsorship organizations landed in Finland and received a lot of attention. The number of sponsors stopped growing and Interpedia discussed the possibilities of competing with large organizations. The decision to move the office to Helsinki was made.

Pagamas is proud of her situation and the independence it affords her, as well as the opportunity she is offered. It means a lot to her – she comes from a very poor home and her classmates at school made fun of her clothes and her family's poverty.

Although Pagamas was initially very surprised that a complete stranger in a faraway country wanted to support her, she says that without financial support, she would never have reached the position she has today. And the feeling that someone believed in her and gave extra support to her dreams and aspirations was especially important to Pagamas!

I sponsored s girl in Ethiopia

My friend suggested to me that we both sponsor a child through Interpedia. I had never heard of Interpedia before, but she assured me that they do good work there. So I got excited about it and we both decided to sponsor a child. I wanted to help a girl who comes from one of the poorest countries in the world. We both ended up with the same result and two female pupils of the German Church School in Addis Ababa were suggested to us.

So it was probably in the spring of 2003 that I became Milki's sponsor.

When I started sponsoring Milki, his father had already been in prison for a long time. The reason for the arrest was that he had worked in the school office during the time of the wrong government. Milki's father had however studied at university. When the family no longer had a decent income, the mother had to sell furniture to make ends meet.

We planned early on that we would visit our sponsored children in their own environment. We had the opportunity to go on such a trip in February 2004. At that time, Milki's situation was better already, because his father had been released from prison in December.

We thought hard about what we could take there. We ended up sewing "pencil bags" with at least a ballpoint pen and a ruler, maybe there was something else too. We probably made about 90 of them and distributed them to the students in the lower grades. In addition, I had taken with me a series of slides that showed the winter and summer in Finland. One of the teachers at the school wanted to see my presentation beforehand, which I thought was wise. The presentation passed the inspection, and I presented the pictures in English. I followed while the female teacher continued to tell the students about it. It would have been fun to know what she was talking about, because the narration was many times longer than what I had talked about. The children listened and watched in silence. Anyway, it was a pleasure to see how well the school was run and how polite the students were. We also got to listen to the lesson in the eighth grade, where the chemistry lesson was going on.

We both had the opportunity to visit the homes of the children we sponsored. Milki had two sisters and a brother who were all older than her. It was a pity that the parents were not at home then because they had to go to a funeral. All the children were in good shape, but the apartment was in a real slum. The home had been made as good as it was possible under the circumstances. There was both a common living area and a separate room for the children, which just barely fit a shared bed. We gave them some presents, talked for a while, and continued to my friend's sponsored child's home. Conditions there were much cleaner and even the houses had paint. However, the home was very small, and we wondered how the whole family could fit in there. We hadn't realized that the scissors belonging to the sewing kit were such a wonderful gift to the girl's mother that she received them on her palms and bowed deeply.

During the trip, we stayed at Fida's former children's home in Debre Zyit. It was interesting to live further away from the capital and see the country a little more widely. A young man in a Toyota van drove us around. It was quite funny that there was a sticker in the back window of the car: Toyotalla Suomi kuljettaa! (Finland transports with Toyota!) We also flew to Lalibela and visited its famous rock churches. All in all, the trip was very interesting and enlightening.

And back to the main thing, Milki. Every year I received a letter and a photo from Milki. This way I could follow her development. She often wrote that she wanted to work hard at school, and she really did. Previously, she had told what she wanted to become when she grows up, a doctor for example. She did get into university, but in the end, she graduated as an IT engineer. You can imagine my joy when Teklu Tafesse, the Director of the German Church School, sent me a certificate of her academic performance in the summer of 2018, and a letter of thanks for being a sponsor. The highlight of the parcel was a picture of Milki in her graduation outfit.


